1. Apologies

2. Declarations of Interest

3. Minute of meeting

The minutes of these meetings were approved, proposed by GM, seconded by CAC.

4. Treasurer's Report

The balance on 28 October 2024 was £4185.45 of which £2184.60 is restricted for the newsletter and £386.36 for administration costs. £688 had been paid out since the last meeting, and nil income.

5. Road Safety Issues

RL had attended the Active Travel Group and Fort William 2040 Stakeholder Group with updates as follows:

- 1) Crossing at Banavie Canal Bridge** – Counting is in place as well as camera monitoring. The next steps will be a design and consultation stage. There is optimism that the reduced speed limit may support the case for a crossing.
- 2) Access to New Housing** – The path network is not suitable for cyclists. Cllr Kate Willis has written to Helen Cameron at The Highland Council to advise the design is not adequate.
- 3) Signage** - Gerard Kelly of Bear Scotland said he would investigate a Welcome to Corpach speed sign.

4) Integrated Transport Plan – This is in development and is anticipated to be available soon for consultation.

5) Nevis Bridge Roundabout – Transport Scotland are actively looking at options at this location in terms of easing the summer congestion.

6. Consultation for a mobile Phone Mast

It was considered that the proposed location is reasonably sensitively sited and that there are no grounds for objection.

7. Climate change

8. AOCB

- 1) It was noted that in terms of the annual accounts the shed, as a capital asset, needs to show depreciation at 10% per year.
- 2) The Community Fridge and Garden has been awarded a grant of £1700 from the Co-op Community Fund. This will be paid into to the Community Council's Bank Account, but will need transferred over to Kilmallie Community Fridge and Garden now that it is an established charitable organisation.
- 3) There was a reminder from Cllr Saggors to review and comment on The Highland Council's Community Council Scheme Review.
- 4) It was reported that the Christmas Lights group had been successful in their fund raising.
